It has now been nine months since the successful transfer of the National Office to our new purpose built facility at 12 Sladen Street in Hamlyn Heights, Geelong.

The new National Office looks great and we are finding that the office under Joy Sgro's administration is running in a most efficient manner for the Fellowship. The National Office will be used as the venue for our next National Board meeting to be held in July 2011.

If you are ever visiting the Geelong region, you are encouraged and most welcome to stop in at your new National Office of FGBMFI Australia.

The 2011 FGBMFI Regional Directors meeting was held in Melbourne over the weekend of the 4th and 5th February 2011. FGBMFI leaders from all parts of the nation participated with passion in prayer, discussion, reports and their vision for the Fellowship.

Those who participated included David Kleyweg from Tasmania, Charles Rockefeller, Bill Sgro and Rex Cardwell from Victoria, Tony Brain, Rhys Hewett, Rod Winter and Steve Harlow from South Australia, Wayne Barnett, Dinko Miocevic, Garry Pratt from Western Australia, John Dona from the Northern Territory, Anthony Connell from New South Wales/ACT, Mike Crosby, Bernie Gray, Peter Monson, and Tony Vaughan from Queensland.

We thank these men for making the effort to attend

this meeting and for sharing their passion and strategies to win lost souls into the Kingdom of God.

The FGBMFI leadership has a burning desire to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ to our community in outreach testimony and personal witness in 2011.

The final tally of 2010 FGBMFI Chapter activity has been compiled. The results were encouraging. 298 Chapter outreach meetings were held around Australia in 2010 by FGBMFI Chapters. This does not include Chapter prayer or Chapter business meetings.

Outreach meetings organised by FGBMFI Chapters include dinners, mayoral prayer breakfasts, breakfasts, lunches, general outreach meetings, or school community talks, etc. The attendance at the 298 outreach meetings was approximately 11,200

people with 76 people making a commitment to the Lord Jesus Christ.

In 2010, we had 30 active Chapter fellowships and another 12 areas with an FGBMFI contact or presence. What a terrific result for the Kingdom of God with 76 souls being welcomed into the Kingdom because of the Fellowship's activity.

Our challenge with the Holy Spirit's empowering and guidance, is to have even more souls come into the Kingdom in 2011 - as our efforts on earth will produce eternal rewards in heaven.

I have to remind myself that I am only on earth for a short time and my true home is in heaven.

So please reflect on these words of Jesus in Matthew 6:19-21

"Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moth and rust do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

I would encourage the members of the Fellowship to continue doing the good Christian work and outreach in 2011 and Invest your time and finances on earth in Heavenly treasure!

We are already seeing the benefits of not having to pay a property owner a monthly rental lease of \$1,400. The rental lease money saved in 2011 will amount to at least \$16,800 a year. Praise the Lord for this saving as it allows more financial resources to be spent on outreach ministry.

In 2011 about \$5,000 has been spent on a new FGBMFI website. The National Office spent about \$3,000 on Chapter Public Liability Insurance to provide insurance cover for all FGBMFI Chapter meetings. Individual Chapters were not required to financially contribute to this cover so saving the individual Chapters an expense.

I would like to thank all FGBMFI members and those in the Partnership program for their monthly financial support on the Fellowship. Every effort is made by the National Office to spend these financial resources wisely, in a manner which grows the Kingdom of God on earth.

Lord, teach us HOW TO PRAY

In Luke 11-1 a disciple came and asked Jesus, "Lord teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples." Jesus then taught them what we now call 'The Lord's prayer'.

When I was filled with the Spirit, I started to pray for people like never before.

As I drove down the road I would pray for people as I passed their property because I knew most of them by name. Then six months down the track the Lord said to me, "I'm going to teach you a new way to pray, You claim the victory I've already won on the cross for that person or that situation". After that, when I prayed for someone it was like I was stretching out my hand and literally taking hold of that incredible victory that He had already won on the cross for them.

Didn't He say as He died on the cross, "It is finished". The victory was complete.

In one particular case I heard of a teacher who had been ill for a number of months and unable to work. The doctors couldn't find out what was causing the problem.

I felt a touch on the heart to pray for her and so I prayed, "Lord, I claim the incredible victory you've already won on the cross for her, in Jesus name". Sometime later I was wondering what had happened so I enquired of another teacher. The answer was, 'She is back at work, she was lucky'!!!

Something else I have asked for when praying for people is, "Lord I pray they will not be taken until they know you as Lord and Saviour of their lives." And/or, "I pray I will



see their face at your table on that day, in Jesus name." "I pray you will come through to them in a way that they can actually receive it and understand it, in Jesus name".

We are called in FGB to further the Kingdom of God in many ways. In witnessing, in reaching out, showing His loving kindness to those around us and being a support and help to those who are shepherds of the flock. They appreciate it when they know that we are willing to pray and support them.

VICTORIA

Chief Inspector Gary Raymond APM, OAM (Rtd.) and Melinda Dwight were the key note speakers in Kyabram, at the Victorian State FGBMFI on Friday 17th and Saturday 18th June, at the Living Waters Multipurpose Building.

Gary performed 1500 rescues of which 1,000 were motor vehicle accident rescues, 200 vertical rescues and 200 suicide crisis negotiation retrievals. As a result of accumulated sensory stimuli, things 'smelt touched and heard' on casualty missions, relationships in his life deteriorated. Gary reflects:

"I was a success - I'd become part of an elite Police Rescue team that most only dream about joining. I felt superior and proud - I didn't need God, or any other person. People wonder how a law enforcer can be an offender at the same time - but I was. I was an incredibly selfish person who was often offending other people. My life drastically changed for the better."

Gary will be speaking to local youth in schools and on Friday night. On Saturday night he will share his story over dinner.

He will be available for interviews either before or during his visit to the district...

Melinda Dwight, who sits on the Australian Christian Churches World Missions Executive, is a relevant, down-to-earth communicator. Melinda will be speaking on Saturday over lunch.

"My life ambition is to be a millionaire - in souls. To influence one million people for the Kingdom of God... a journey of faith that is stretching, unusual, exhilarating, frustrating, draining, and amazing."

Other speakers for the convention include:

- Andrew Wickham, a parts representative in the heavy transport industry from Lakes Entrance. He will share his story over breakfast on Saturday. 'Does God cares about Aussie

Battlers?'

- Adrian Commadeur, a gifted leader, author, and publisher with a genuine passion for helping people.

- Rex Cardwell who will offer insight into the role of thankfulness in our lives. Rex is well known in the Whittlesea area. This came to the fore in his community throughout the Black Saturday bushfires.

In May Rod and Bradley went with Jimmy Njiino to North and East Malaysia. Once again this was a fantastic time of ministry.

At least 50 people attended the event, and 2 people accepted Christ as their Lord and Saviour. Teen Challenge was supported by the event.
